In this lecture Reformation historian Eamon Duffy reflects on the ways in which modern fictional accounts of the English Reformation have created, reflected or challenged historical understanding.

Over the last few decades it has been restored by Sir David Davies, President of the Irish Georgian Society. This talk will explore the architectural history of the house.
